MAWLID AL-NABI

Speech delivered by Sheikh Mohamed Ewais at MWA's Mawlid al-Nabi Function

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Islam:

Our topic today is about the Birth of Rasul Allah (PBUH).

In these same days, since more than fourteen centuries Rasul Allah (BUM) was born and Allah (SWT) sent him to the whole world as a mercy and guidance.

In the time of pre Islamic age, the whole world was living in darkness and mankind lived worse than animals, man used to cast different statues and worshipped it, sacrificed for it.

Other people worshipped fire, stars even trees. Apart from their idolatiy, even people of the book, Jews and Christians, diverted their books changed their belief.

They used to drink, toxicate their minds, commit adultery, gamble, run clubs for their corruption, fight for no good reasons, kill each other, the strong slaved the weak, the rich oppressed the poor. The Oppression was the law among the people, and the whole world at that time divided between two powers - Persians and Romans - and war between these two powers never ended, small countries followed either Persians or Romans.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Islam:

In such state of corruption Allah (SOOT) wants guidance to his slaves, free them from slavery of human beings to be surrender to Allah SWT and to live in the light of guidance rather than living in darkness of ignorance.

LADY AYESHA BINT ABU BAKR AL-SIDDIQ

Ayesha was born in the month of Shawwal, four years after the conferment of the Prophethood on the Noble Prophet (S.W.A)

She belonged to the Banu Taim clan of the Quraish. Her mother's name was Umm Rumman, who was also a companion of the Prophet, enjoying an extremely high rank among his devoted companions. Aisha's title was Humaira and she was given the surname of Umm Abdullah.

She grew up as a child under the benign guradianship and care of her father, Abu Bakr al-Siddiq, a man of exceptional qualities and a trusted companion of the Noble Prophet, who was held in high esteem by all the people. Aysha was a very intelligent and responsible and remembered all the happenings of her childhood.

The prophet (S.W.A) was given the glad tidings of his marriage to Aysha in a dream. He saw that a person was showing him something wrapped up in silk and saying "It is for you, so take it." When the Prophet (S.W.A) opened it, he found Ayesha in the silk wrapping. The marriage ceremony was very simple.

Ayesha was very dear to the Prophet. Musnad Abu Dawud relates that the Prophet (S.W.A) used to say: "O Allah! I treat all my wives equally. But I have no control on my emotions and I am more inclined to Ayesha. Please forgive my heart for this."

When nine years of Ayesha's married life had passed, the Prophet fell ill - and on the 9th or 12th of Rabi-alAwwal, in the Hijra year, the Prophet left for his heavenly abode. At the time of his death, the Prophet's head was resting on Ayesha's chest and her room got the unique honour of serving as his final resting place.

The remaining 40 years of Ayesha's life were spent in widowhood. During all this period, she remained a great source of guidance and inspiration, a radiating beacon of knowledge and learning and an everlasting fountainhead of blessing. Ayesha has related in all 2210 sayings of the Prophet. According to some scholars, at least one-fourth

of Sharia injunctions are traceable to her as source.

Many renowned companions would ask her questions on all topics. Abu Musa al-Ashari says that the people didn't face a problem to which Ayesha didn't offer a solution. She knew personally the precedents of the Prophet for every eventuality. Urwah bin Zubair says that he never saw anyone who could equal Ayesha in the knowledge of the Qur'an, Hadith, Figh, History and science of genealogy, Ahnaf bin Qais and Musa bin Talha narrate that they never found anyone as eloquent as Ayesha. While Muiawiyah says that he never came across a more eloquent, a more flowery, a more consummate orator and a writer person than Ayesha.

The books of biography relate many narrations which prove that besides religious knowledge, Ayesha had the knowledge of medicine, history, poetry as well as literature. She has such a lofty status in the domain of religious learning and moral excellence that thousands of pages would not suffice to describe it. Suffice to say, there was no one to equal her in so far as intellectual attainments, service to the religion of Islam and dissemination of the teachings of the Prophet are concerned. There would be no exaggeration, if she is called the 'benefactress of the community'.

Ibn Abdul Barr quotes the Prophet in his book "Instiaab" thus: "Superiority of Ayesha over other women is comparable to the superioty of the bread dipped in gravy (a favourite dish of the Arabs) to other dishes. During the period of Umar bin al-Khattab Caliphate, all the wives of the Prophet were alloted ten thousand dirhams annually. However Ahesha was assigned twelve thousand dirhams. Umar explained the reason that he had done so as Ayesha was very dear to the Prophet.

When Umar was at his death-bed, he sent his son Abdullah to Ayesha to ask her if she could give him the permission to be buried beside the Prophet. Ayesha replied: "I had kept the place for myself, but for Umar's sake, I forsake it". It is by dint of Ayesha's exceptional sacrifice that Umar is resting in his grave next to the Noble Prophet.

After Umar, Uthman became the third Caliph. During his Caliphate, there emerged many conspiracies and disputes which finally led to the grievous martyrdom of Uthman. Uthman remained without food and water for three days and while he was reciting the Holy Qur'an, the miscreants killed him mercilessly. This dastardly assassination greatly pained Ayesha.

Concerning Ayesha's great erudition and scholarship it is said that Ayesha had nearly 200 students, some famous names among whom bin Muhannad, Masrooq Tabii, Ayesha bint Talha, Abu Salmah and Arwah bin Zubair. Whenever Ayesha narrated a Hadith, she would relate its reason, context and backgroud. Whatever explanations she offered would require a far-fetched interpretation.

She disliked blind imitation and always tried to go deep into the real spirit behind the sayings and deeds of the Prophet. Abu Saeed al-Khudri was a companion of the Prophet of a very high rank. When he was approaching death he bought a new cloth and wore it. He said: "The Prophet says that a Muslim will be resurrected in the same dress which he might be wearing at the time of his death." Hearing this, Ayesha said: "May Allah have mercy on Abu Saeed. By clothes the Prophet meant one's deeds.

In terms of moral excellence, Ayesha stands on a high to fault, pedestal. She was very generous, hospitable and would look after the poor and needy. Once Abdullah bin Zubair sent her one hundred thousand dirhams. She immediately, distributed them among the poor and the destitute. She happened to be fasting on that day. In the evening her maid-servant told Ayesha: O Mother of the Believers! Wouldn't it have been better if you had bought some meat with that money for Iftar" She replied: You should have reminded me.

Urwah bin Zubair says that once Ayesha received a gift of 70 thousand dirhams. She gave away the entire money then and there in the cause of Allah and swept her shawl clean (that had the money).

Imam Malik says in "Muwatta that once Ayesha was fasting and there was nothing in the house except a piece of bread. A beggar woman came and asked for some food. Ayesha ordered her maid to give that piece of bread to the beggar. The maid asked: What will you have for Iftar (breaking the fast at sunset)" Ayesha replied: "You give away this to her". In the evening someone sent her some mutton as gift. She said to the maid: Look! Allah has sent something better than bread.

She was an extremely pious and God-fearing lady. She should inconsably cry whenever she came across an incident or a verse of the Qur'an which would evoke Allah's fear and wrath. Once she said that whenever she ate to her fill, she would cry. Asked by her pupils about the reason, she replied "I remember those days when the Prophet left

this world. By God! He never had a proper meal of bread and mutton even twice a day."

Ayesha died in Ramadhan 58 Hijra, at the age of 67 years.

As per her will, she was buried in Baqi at night after the witr prayers. Abu Huraira led her funeral prayers. Such a huge gathering had never been seen at any other funeral.

People from all over the then Muslim world felt bereaved and experience a great loss.

Ayesha had no children, and after the consent of the Prophet she preferred to be addressed as Umm Abdullah after her nephew Abdullah bin Zubair.

A Muslim Home for Children in Need of Care in London

AN APPEAL

MADINA HOUSE is a Muslim home for children in need of care, established in 1981 under the auspices of the Muslim Women's Association (a registered charity which has been functioning since 1962).

From its inception the organisers worked closely with the Department of Health and Social Security and all other Social Services Agencies in order to comply with the current guidelines on the running of Children's Homes. Subsequently Madina House was registered by the Department of S.S.I. under the Child Care Act.

Aim - The main aim of Madina House is to provide an alternative home for children who for whatever reason, are temporarily unable to live with their parent/s. At Madina House we provide a stable, caring background, founded on Islamic principles and practices. Since its founding we have cared for over 400 children.

The present home does no longer comply with today's regulations and we have been asked to find more suitable accommodation. Thus, we are in desperate need of finance to buy an appropriate building. Failing to do so, the future of Madina House is in question.

KITCHEN TALK

FOODS THAT FIGHT CANCER Part II

Research suggests that garlic compounds may even interfere with cancer progression. A recent German study found that ajoene, a garlic compound, is toxic to malignant cells. Garlic may also antagonize existing cancer by boosting immune functions, according to researchers at Loma Linda University School of Medicine. Their study, done on mice, found that garlic's sulfur compounds increased the activity of microphones and T-lymphocytes, two of the components of the immune system that destroy tumor cells.

Citrus Fruits

"Eat oranges, grapefruits, lemons and limes as often as possible," says toxicologist Herbert Pierson, a former project officer with the National Cancer Institute. He calls citrus fruit an all-round cancer package because it possesses every class of natural substances (carotenoids, flavonoids and others) that individually have neutralised powerful chemical carcinogens in animals.

Citrus fruit may be particularly effective in reducing the risk of pancreatic cancer. One study found that in a group of Swedes, those who ate a citrus fruit almost daily reduced the risk of pancreatic cancer by one-half to more than two-thirds, as compared with eating citrus fruit less than once a week.

Cruciferous* Vegetables

Such as cabbage, cauliflower, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, kale, mustard greens and turnips, may reduce the risk of breast cancer. In fact, researchers at Eppley Institute for Research in Cancer and Allied Diseases at the University of Nebraska at Omaha found that feeding animals cabbage and collard greens (also a cruciferous vegetable), along with a low-fat diet, reduced the incidence of mammary cancer. Eat crucifer vegetables raw or lightly cooked. Overcooking may destroy the indoles, compounds found in these vegetables that may protect against cancer.

Cruciferous vegetables may also work to head off stomach and colon cancer. Research conducted in Utah revealed that men who ate the most cruciferous vegetables had a 70% lower risk of colon cancer that those who ate the least of such vegetables.
